 $\underline{BRANCHING\ OUT}\ \text{After an inspirational\ trip\ to\ Virunga\ National\ Park\ in}$ Congo last winter, Sylvie Chantecaille was compelled to do something to protect the stunning silverback gorillas she saw suffering from deforestation. Every minute, 50 acres of rainforest are slashed and burned, eliminating two dozen species daily. Her philanthropic beauty brand, Chantecaille, collaborated with the Rainforest Alliance to launch the Save the Forest palette, featuring earthy eye shadows in Dawn (a shimmering ochre), Mist (a soft pink highlighter), Volcano (a rich brown) and Bamboo (a deep olive green). A portion of the proceeds from each palette helps protect the precious wildlife and diminishing forest, making them some of the most beautiful earth tones of the season. -Phebe Wahl
