Lately, half the travel-focused accounts on Instagram seem to star colorful, chic Colombia. Two of the country's biggest style-setters—mother-and-daughter team Paula Sierra and Luciana Arango operate the popular **Zona E** home decor store near Medellin, and they've just opened a second location at the new Latin marketplace, **La Cosecha** (1280 Fourth St. NW, [lacosechadc.com](http://lacosechadc.com)) near Union Market. The pair—Luciana is a sophomore at George Washington University—stocks the breezy space with the same mashup of South America-meets-Southern California style as the original boutique. Think weathered wooden statues; beach-hued sofas; and lush greenery, both real and faux. "We have no rules, and love mixing and matching," says Paula. "Rooms need a touch of magic to make them fun and modern." In this store, it might mean mini crystal chandeliers paired with wood and metal bookcases.
